PAPERLESS ORDER denying [157] Defendant

Steven Dorfman's Motion to Dissolve Preliminary Injunction [157]. Defendant Dorfman argues that the Court must dissolve the Preliminary Injunction because the FTC did not initiate an administrative proceeding within twenty days after issuance of the Temporary Restraining Order. The Court disagrees.

As set forth in long established Eleventh Circuit precedent, the FTC may obtain preliminary injunctive relief while pursuing a permanent injunction in a federal district court action brought pursuant to Section 13(b) of the FTC Act. <I>See FTC v. U.S. Oil & Gas Corp.</I>, 748 F.2d 1431, 1434 (11th Cir. 1984) (rejecting defendant's argument that the preliminary injunction had to be dissolved because the FTC did not bring an administrative action

within twenty days of the issuance of the temporary restraining order).
